Recharge	£10056	Recharge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This funding will support the ongoing work of the Recharge youth facility in Tranent – it will be used specifically to provide additional drop in sessions – analysis of local need identified the need for provision at these times.</li> </ul>
Carefree Kids	£11482	Carefree Kids	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Carefree Kids provides home safety equipment on loan to families on low income with children under the age of five – this funding will cover staffing costs;</li> <li>The organisation also provides information and advice on home safety issues and delivers first aid training.</li> </ul>

Try for Life	£5000	Prestonpans RFC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This project will bring in a new partner in the form of Prestonpans Rugby Club to deliver rugby based youth diversionary work in the Prestonpans area – the area around the Rugby Club has in the past been a hot spot of young people getting involved in antisocial and nuisance behaviour.</li> </ul>
Longniddry CCTV	£700	Longniddry Community Council	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Longniddry Community Council applied for part funding to support the purchase on an additional CCTV.</li> </ul>
Violence Against Women Strategy Coordinator			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This funding will be used to employ a Strategy Coordinator to develop the work of the joint East / Mid Violence Against Women Forum.</li> </ul>
Violence Against Women Service Delivery			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Violence Against Women Forum was awarded further funding to support service delivery – this will be used to part fund a Police Domestic Abuse Advocacy Worker and to support the Edinburgh Women's Rape and Sexual</li> </ul>

Risk Factory	£13,170	Risk Factory	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This funding is part of an ongoing commitment to the Risk Factory community safety education centre – the Risk Factory is jointly funded by East, Mid and West Lothian Councils, along with the City of Edinburgh Council;</li> <li>• All primary 7 classes in East Lothian can attend the Risk Factory for a half day session.</li> </ul>
